Lionfish, Koh Tao, Thailand – The Lionfish feeds on small fish, crustaceans and molluscs. It hunts at night and hides in caves or coral reefs during the day. They have few natural enemies as their venom is potentially lethal to other animals. However, it can be eaten by some larger fish such as sharks or barracudas.

Limestone Cave, Avaiki, Niue, Pacific – Sea caves, natural arches and swimming holes punctuate the island's rugged and rocky coastline, and Niue's porous combination of coral and limestone acts like a giant sponge. This geological quirk means no rivers, creeks or run-offs leach into the ocean, so the snorkelling, diving and fishing are all spectacular.

Powderblue Surgeonfish, Malé, Maldives – This species is found in the Indian Ocean and, like most fish in the family Acanthuridae, is herbivorous – eating mostly benthic algae. It is solitary, territorial and aggressive with other surgeonfish. In cases where food is plentiful, it may feed in shoals, but in cases of scarcity it may compete individually for food.

Isla de Mouro, Santander, Spain – Mouro Island is a small uninhabited island in the Bay of Biscay, located off the Magdalena Peninsula. The only structure on the island is a 19th-century lighthouse, which is now automated. Mouro Island has a high biodiversity of fish and plant life, and was declared a marine reserve in 1986 – with a perimeter extending to 300m (1,014ft) surrounding the island.
